#### **Negatives**

Students all over the country were deprived of regular education for months and some stopped going to schools even after everything was resumed.

Citizens who were trying to get back to Nepal went through tough times when they were stopped at borders. The farmers also suffered as they couldn't bring their produce to the marketplace. Many people lost their businesses, their jobs, and normal life.





Overall it was a tragic moment for all the people who suffered. These bitter moments will leave a mark throughout their life. But for now, everyone must move on and try to rebuild what was lost with whatever we have now.

#### **Positives**

There are a few positive things about the pandemic too. Students learned the importance of technology. For most children, the phone and the internet are the means of entertainment only. However, the lockdown had forced most students to use the same devices and the internet for studies, online classes, and even online examinations. DMS and many schools all over Nepal have opted for these methods due to the pandemic.





Online studies have been a regular thing in western countries for a while now but Nepal was lagging in such methods. The pandemic may have boosted the potential of online studies in Nepal and it will not come as a surprise if many schools and universities bring this method into practice more often.

Another great deal that everyone learned was to understand how easily viruses can spread and what preventive measures are needed according to the nature of disease. People also learned proper sanitation habits can help a lot to avoid germs and other diseases.



#### **Second Terminal Examination Held**

Dolphin Magic School has successfully held the Second Terminal Exam for the year 2021. All the students from Playgroup to Grade 8 participated in the exams. The examination was held through the 10th, 11th, and 12th of January this year.







Unlike the First Terminal Exam, the second one was held in the school like the normal examination in the history of DMS. The first terminal had to be done online due to the pandemic where limited students were able to participate.

The result of the second terminal examination was published on January 31st. According to the Principal of DMS, "The result was satisfactory considering the time when students were deprived of the regular education. We have noticed that the students need revising on few important topics and I'm sure we will be back to normal like nothing ever happened."

After the troublesome year of 2020, this year's academic timeline has shifted more than 7 months. However, DMS has been putting all efforts into rebuilding what was damaged in the difficult times of the pandemic.

#### Winter Vacation

Right after the Second Terminal Examination students were provided 2 weeks of winter vacation from 11th January-23rd January 2021. Every year the school has provided winter vacation during the coldest months of the year which happened to be in January this year.





Although this year's winter was comparatively less cold, the winters in Nepal can be very harsh and unpredictable. The school and all regular activities resumed to normal from 24 January 2021.

#### **Construction Work: Wall construction**

A wall that was being constructed next to the playground has been completed. The construction work was provided to the regular Contractor Kanchha Tamang and he has done a fantastic job. The 30 ft. high and 80 ft. long wall is built on the west side of the new playground.



The main purpose of the wall is to prevent landslide from above the playground which can be costly after the completion of other construction works in DMS. Last year we had a similar situation where plenty of debris from the landslide ended up in the playground. Luckily, no one was in the vicinity and the playground was still under construction, so the clearing up did not cost much.



The area of Pharping is prone to landslides during monsoon. Therefore, it is better to ensure the safety of everyone around the area and the school property.

#### **Biogas**

It has been more than 5 months that the biogas plant was completed, yet the biogas hasn't been ready for use. The problem with the biogas plant is that it needs enough feeding to get it started at first. Once the required quantity is fed to the plant, a small amount of regular feeding will work.

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic and the lockdown, the school was shut for months which directly affected the amount of organic matter fed to the biogas plant.





Now that the school is reopened and is already in a full swing, it shouldn't take much longer to start producing the biogas and become independent. Not to mention the plant will save huge expenses for cooking fuel that was being spent every year.

### **Sports Week**

The Sports Week for the year 2021 was organized from 28th February to 5th March. Like every year all students participated in the weeklong event. The senior students participated in sports such as Volleyball, Football, Badminton, and the Tug of War. Participants had to win the Knock out rounds to progress to the next stage of the competition until the Final.



The juniors from P.G. to Grade 2 participated in Musical Chair, Spoon Race, and Balloon Blast. Everyone looked super excited and eager to participate.











Sport is a great source of entertainment and helps to maintain one's physical fitness. To be a good sportsman one needs fitness, tactics and a sense of teamwork and those who won the competition surely demonstrated it.

The prize distribution will be held on School Day which has also been delayed due to several months of lockdown. The prize will be distributed in the presence of the parents and distinguished guests who are related to educational sector. All the winners and the runner-up's will be provided with medals and a "Certificate of Appreciation" from Dolphin Magic School.

#### Thomas and Usha arrive in Nepal


